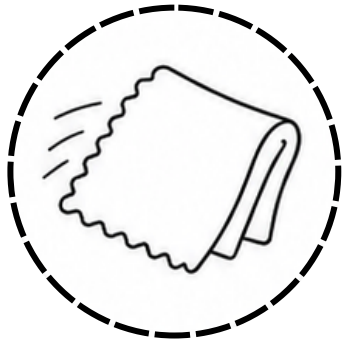
TAG Carpet Collection is designed to provide comfort, texture, durability, and refined interior performance. This guide provides basic care and maintenance recommendations to help preserve the carpet's appearance, quality, and performance over time.



1. GENERAL CARE

TAG Carpet products are intended for approved interior flooring applications only. Depending on the selected style, products may include carpet tile, loop construction, nylon fiber, solution-dyed yarns, and PVC backing.

Carpet must be handled, installed, cleaned, and maintained properly. Damage caused by misuse, improper cleaning, moisture, stains, chemicals, excessive wear, incorrect installation, unsuitable site conditions, or lack of maintenance is not considered a product defect.



2. ROUTINE CLEANING

Vacuum regularly using a commercial-grade vacuum suitable for carpet. High-traffic areas should be vacuumed more frequently to prevent dirt from becoming embedded in the fibers.

Use walk-off mats at entrances to reduce dirt, moisture, and debris. Mats must be cleaned or replaced regularly.



3. SPOT CLEANING

Clean spills immediately. Blot gently with a clean white cloth; do not rub or scrub, as this may spread the stain or damage the fibers.

Use only carpet-approved cleaning solutions and always test in a hidden area first. For difficult stains, professional carpet cleaning is recommended.

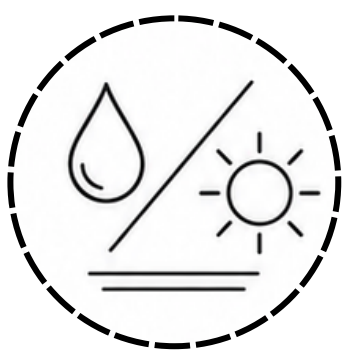
Staining, discoloration, residue, fiber damage, or texture change caused by spills, improper cleaning products, or delayed cleaning is not considered a manufacturing defect.



4. PRODUCTS AND METHODS TO AVOID

Do not use bleach, harsh chemicals, abrasive cleaners, solvents, oils, waxes, strong alkaline cleaners, or unapproved stain removers.

Do not over-wet the carpet, steam excessively, soak the backing, or allow moisture to remain trapped under the carpet. Do not use cleaning methods that leave sticky residue, as this may attract more dirt.



5. MOISTURE AND HEAT PROTECTION

Carpet is for interior use only and must not be exposed to standing water, leaks, exterior conditions, uncontrolled humidity, or moisture from the subfloor.

Moisture may cause staining, odor, mildew, mold, backing deterioration, adhesive failure, tile movement, or installation failure. These conditions are not considered product defects.

Keep carpet away from excessive heat, direct sunlight, heaters, fireplaces, or intense localized lighting. UV exposure and lighting conditions may affect color appearance over time.

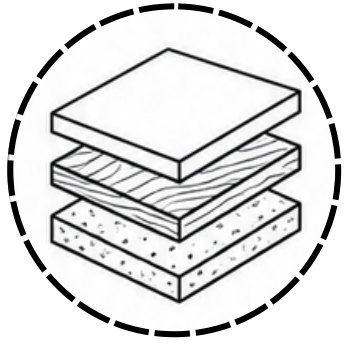


6. TRAFFIC, FURNITURE, AND DAMAGE PREVENTION

Protect carpet from sharp objects, dragging furniture, heavy impacts, rolling loads, construction debris, and improper handling.

Use furniture glides, chair mats, or floor protection where needed. Heavy furniture may cause indentation or compression marks. Rotate furniture and rugs when possible to reduce uneven wear.

Crushing, matting, shading, pile distortion, indentation, pulled loops, snags, cuts, burns, or damage caused by traffic, furniture, misuse, or construction activity is not considered a manufacturing defect.

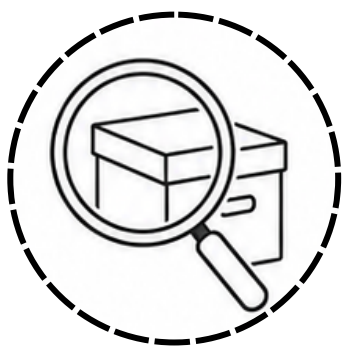


7. PROFESSIONAL MAINTENANCE

A regular maintenance program is required to preserve carpet performance. Professional cleaning frequency depends on traffic level, use, environment, and project conditions.

All professional cleaning must be performed using methods suitable for the specific carpet type and backing.

Over-wetting, improper extraction, excessive moisture, or unapproved chemicals may damage the carpet and are not covered as product defects.

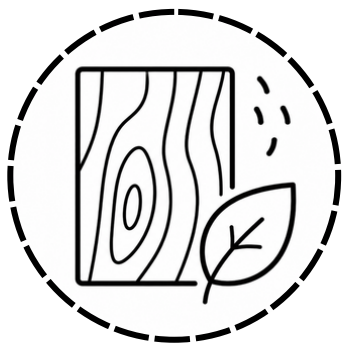


8. INSPECTION AND STORAGE

Inspect carpet before installation for visible damage, color concerns, or product inconsistencies. Installation of material constitutes acceptance of visible conditions.

Before installation, store carpet in a clean, dry, temperature-controlled interior area, away from moisture, sunlight, dust, construction debris, and heavy objects.

Carpet must be installed over properly prepared substrates using approved installation methods, adhesives, and site conditions. TAG is not responsible for damage caused by improper storage, jobsite conditions, subfloor issues, moisture, transportation after delivery, or installation by others.



9. NATURAL APPEARANCE CHARACTERISTICS

Color, texture, pattern, pile direction, shading, dye lot variation, seams, and visual differences between samples, images, renderings, and installed material may occur.

Carpet may show normal changes from use, traffic, lighting, vacuuming direction, furniture placement, and maintenance conditions. These visual variations are normal and are not considered defects.



10. FINAL RECOMMENDATIONS

Proper care, handling, storage, installation, and maintenance are required to preserve the aesthetic and functional performance of TAG Carpet Collection products.

TAG is not responsible for damage caused by improper cleaning, moisture, stains, impact, misuse, chemical exposure, unauthorized modifications, unsuitable site conditions, incorrect installation, lack of maintenance, normal wear and tear, or conditions outside TAG's control.
